Living God's way: Pleasing him

"God did not call us to be impure, but to live a holy life"
1 Thessalonians 4:1-8

Welcome to today's service!

We've spent several months grounding ourselves in the central truths of the Christian faith that we find in the words of the Creed, but we changed gear last week for our Gift Day and started to think about some of the practical implications of living out our lives to reflect what we believe.

We thought then about giving ourselves and all that we have back to God in response to the way that he has given himself so completely and sacrificially to us. For the next few weeks, we'll continue along those lines, allowing ourselves to be both challenged and encouraged to live our lives God's way. We'll follow St Paul's practical wisdom and guidance in his first letter to the Thessalonian church - written to a small church to reassure them of the certainty of their destiny when Jesus comes again, but also to remind them of the expectation that God has for his people to live lives worthy of their calling. The early church was known for being radically different to the prevailing culture. In fact, that was the reason that the church survived when the background culture collapsed: because they had chosen to live in a radically different way, living to please God, rather than feeding their destructive worldly appetites. What will our choice be today? Will we give in to a prevailing cultural permissiveness and celebration of our right to self-determination, or will we again be prepared to be different, and choose actively to let Jesus rule as Lord of our lives? Ultimately, only the latter will bring us lasting reward and true joy, but we all have to make that choice for ourselves...

**PILGRIM PATHS –
 CHIPPING NORTON DEANERY.**

The church communities, have joined together to develop a network of 'pilgrim paths' throughout the area. There are currently ten such paths, varying in length from three to seven miles. Each path will be accompanied by a booklet with information about the route and suggestions for prayer and meditation which reflect the surrounding landscape. These booklets will be found in the local churches. Three booklets are available so far – for pilgrim paths in Hook Norton, Chipping Norton and Charlbury. Also available is an adventure booklet for children and families.

To launch this venture Guided Circular Walks will take place as follows:

Meet at the church at 10am. Bring your own food and drink.

- Friday 21st July: SS Simon and Jude Milton under Wychwood (OX7 6LJ) to Shipton under Wychwood 3 miles
- Friday 18th August: St Mary's Chipping Norton (OX7 5NT) to Over Norton 6 miles
- Friday 15th September: St Mary's Charlbury (OX7 3PR) to Shorthampton 5 miles
- Friday 20th October: St Denys Little Compton (GL56 0SA) to Chastleton 4 miles.
