I look forward to hearing how you get on and seeing photos of your creativity. Remember to send them to:



French artist Henri Matisse was prevented from painting in 1948 due to ill health but. although he was confined to bed he produced a number of pictures known as gouaches découpées. These were made by cutting or tearing shapes from paper which had been painted. Matisse had to adapt his art style when he became ill to suit his situation.
