You will need:

- Coloured tissue
- Black card
- Wax paper
- Glue & Scissors
- Pencil

Family Craft!
Stained Glass window displays



How to make the 'Stained Glass' window displays:

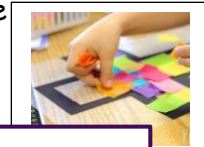
1. Cut out your chosen outside shape from the black card.
Adult supervision important!
2. Be inventive with how you use the card to create the black lines inside the shape to add contrast.



You can cut as a whole piece or cut and glue them separately...

TOP TIP! To start cutting out the inside shape, make a hole by placing card onto a rubber and pushing a sharp pencil through - then you can get your scissors in to cut! Get your adult to help...

3. Cut up small squares of tissue paper and glue them gently into the black shape you have created by over lapping each piece of tissue and sticking together.
4. To make it easier you can stick the wax paper onto the black outside shape as a foundation and then stick the tissue on top.
5. Make sure all the gaps are filled and let the glue dry.
6. You can either stick directly to the window with blutac or make a hole in the top and put a ribbon through to hang near the window so the light shines through.



We ♥ FACTS

-- stained glass was used by the Egyptians and Romans - but they used it to make bowls, cups and small trinkets.
-- you might think stained glass windows just appear in churches to add beauty, but if you look carefully they most often tell a story from the Bible - for example the story of Easter and Jesus' journey to the cross.
