- Glue & Scissors
- String



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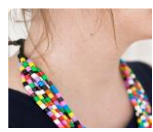
### Family Craft: Africa!

The colour, the creativeness, the jingly-janglyness!  
Don't you just love these African collars?  
Men, women & children still wear these incredible  
Traditional collars and headdresses in some parts of  
Africa-look them up online and be inspired!  
(the Maasai tribe is a good place to start)

### How to make the African collar:

1. Use a paper plate or cut a circle from white card.
2. Cut a slit into the plate/card and cut out the centre circle (see photos for direction and cut to size)
3. Use feltips, paint or collaged paper to colour the collar base.
4. Decorate to your style! Stick on pasta shapes, buttons etc
- 5a. You can make holes along the bottom (opposite side to the slit) and tie on tassels made out of string threaded with beads, cut up straws, pasta shapes, feathers - be creative use what you find!
- 5b. Or you can cut a rectangle piece of card and stick on the bottom, make holes and tie on your threaded tassels
6. You can make a fastening by making a hole in the card either side of the slit and use string to tie.
